Relationships Matter: Your Voice Begins at Home

Every legislative session in Tallahassee reminds us of one important truth: **laws don't change because organizations ask—they change because relationships are built.**

The Federation of Manufactured Home Owners of Florida has earned a respected reputation as a credible voice for manufactured homeowners. That reputation wasn't built overnight, nor was it created by our lobbyist alone. It was built through years of members, community leaders, and local homeowners taking the time to meet with elected officials, explain the unique challenges of living in land-lease manufactured home communities, and become trusted sources of information.

Our legislative successes this past session are a perfect example. While Nancy Black Stewart, our FMO Legislative Counsel, has proven to be an extremely effective lobbyist for our Association, she needs our support.

Working together, FMO members, volunteer leaders, legislative advocacy committee members, and Nancy helped advance meaningful legislation that addressed issues important to manufactured homeowners. While there is always more work to be done, these accomplishments demonstrate what can happen when lawmakers understand our concerns before critical votes are cast.

Those conversations don't begin in the halls of the Capitol. They begin at home.

Your Local Officials Are the Gateway

Every state senator and representative spends much of the year in their home district—not in Tallahassee. During that time, they attend community events, visit civic organizations, hold office hours, and meet with constituents.

That presents an opportunity for every manufactured home community.

HOA boards should make it a priority to introduce themselves to their local legislators. Invite them to tour your community. Show them the quality of today's manufactured homes. Explain how Chapter 723 affects residents. Help them understand the issues facing retirees, working families, veterans, and others who have chosen manufactured housing as an affordable place to live.

Many elected officials have never visited a manufactured home community. Their understanding of our neighborhoods may come from outdated stereotypes rather than firsthand experience. A personal visit can change that perception forever.

Relationships Before You Need Them

One of the biggest mistakes any advocacy organization can make is contacting an elected official only when asking for a vote.

Successful advocacy works differently.

The strongest relationships are built long before legislation is introduced. They are developed through regular communication, invitations to community events, attendance at town hall meetings, and simple conversations that build trust over time.

When legislators already know the people behind the issues, they are far more likely to seek our perspective when bills affecting manufactured homeowners are being considered.

Every Community Can Make a Difference

Whether your HOA has 50 homes or 1,500, your community has a voice.

Imagine the impact if every manufactured home community in Florida had an ongoing relationship with its state representative and state senator. Imagine if every legislator personally knew residents who could explain the real-world effects of proposed legislation.

That network of relationships would be one of the most powerful advocacy tools the FMO could ever have.

Advocacy Is a Team Sport

The FMO, through Nancy Black Stewart, works year-round to represent manufactured homeowners before the Florida Legislature, but our effectiveness depends on the involvement of our members.

Every homeowner can help by:

- Getting to know your state representative and state senator.
- Attending local legislative meetings and town halls.
- Inviting elected officials to visit your community.
- Sharing your personal experiences respectfully and factually.
