### A. PLAY ORGANIZATION WEDNESDAY PLAY STARTS @ 3:30 PM - 4:00 PM NO STARTS AFTER 4:00 PM

- Teams are expected to play their weekly round (Week 1, Week 2, etc.) between 3:30 and 4:00 pm. Each
  team is allowed to miss a maximum of <u>three</u> weekly rounds; each of the three allowed missed rounds must
  either be pre-played (played before its scheduled Wednesday) or made up (played after the round's
  scheduled date).
- Each team is to report to the scorer (picnic) table to pay \$1 per player (\$2 per team) toward SKINS, be assigned playing partners and receive scorecard.
- After playing 18 holes, teams will submit their scorecard at the scorer table, with legible gross scores per hole. Before returning the scorecard, teams are encouraged to double-check it for accuracy. Missing or illegible hole scores will be recorded as a "6."
- Team handicaps will be established after each team records two weekly rounds. Handicaps will then be recalculated after each additional round.
- If there is a weather-related cancellation, play is cancelled for that week. For that reason, pre-plays recorded for that week will not count, and will not count towards the three MAX limit.
- Makeups & Pre-Plays can be completed on TUESDAYS between 10 & 11 am and THURSDAYS between 3 &
   4 pm Makeups & pre-plays are limited to three MAXIMUM (total) per team for the entire season.
- After three (3) make-ups & pre-plays (total), team average plus 20 points will be recorded for any future league nights missed.
- Teams with more than three absences will not be eligible for the Putt-Putt Invitational (aka "Playoffs).

- 9. WEEKLY SS COMPETITIONS: After each Wednesday round, scores are entered and weekly Low Gross, Low Net and SKINS are determined. <u>New this season: All teams who play on Wednesday league night (regardless</u> of any missed weeks) will now be eligible for these weekly SS competitions!
  - SKINS \$\$\square\$ are awarded when only one team has an ace (hole-in-one) on a specific hole for that week
    (excluding hole #8). SKINS \$\$\square\$ will carryover from week to week if there is no outright winner.
  - Teams can only win either the weekly Low Gross or Low Net competition, but not both (long-standing policy).

#### B. PLAY PROCEDURES

- On ODD numbered weeks (Week #1, Week #3, etc.), the designated player #1 will putt all ODD holes first.
- On EVEN numbered weeks, (Week #2, Week #4, etc.), the designated player #2 will putt all ODD holes first.
- Any hole(s) played out of turn (player 1, player 2) must be replayed.

#### C. BASIC RULES OF PLAY

- Players will start playing a hole only after players ahead have cleared the hole.
- Tee area for each hole is located <u>behind</u> the first set of bricks, not inside the bricks.
- Maximum number of strokes to be scored per hole is 6. Max number of strokes posted per team, per round is 54.
- 4. If the ball is within the course, and rests near a sidewalk, rock, brick, or item on the course which hinders your backswing, you may place the ball six inches from the obstacle without penalty. You may not place the ball any closer to the hole. As a guideline, six inches (6") is about the length of any US paper currency.
- If a putt is hit off the course (including a ball rolling backwards and off the course), it is a <u>one stroke</u>
   <u>penalty</u>. To proceed; place the ball where it left the course, but no closer to the hole. Your partner hits the
   next shot, which for scoring now counts as Shot #3.
- If a putt is hit into and then comes to rest within or against the white stones (Holes #2, #11, & #13), you
  must return the ball to the tee and incur a <u>one stroke penalty</u>. Your partner hits the next shot (3<sup>rd</sup> shot)
  from the tee area.
- Ball stuck under the bridge on hole #14; pick up and place the ball on the designated "X". No stroke
  penalty.
- Accidental tapping of the ball on the course counts as one stroke unless placed back to original position.

#### D. EXCEPTIONS

The Putt-Putt Committee reserves the right to modify rules, or grant exceptions as deemed necessary for the league either as a group and/or individually without favoritism or prejudice.

While it is important to maintain a harmonious relationship between FLE Residents and ELS, it is also important to know that the FLE HOA stands firm on these mandates. All FLE residents have an investment that must be protected. The FLE HOA is the ONLY entity recognized by the State of Florida to represent all of the residents of FLE. The HOA works with ELS to assure that the park is maintained appropriately and to protect the best interest of all residents. All residents are encouraged to join the HOA and support the HOA Board of Directors as they work to support you. Board Members are elected each year in January. You must be a paid member to be eligible to run for a seat on the Board and to vote in the election. The fee is \$26 per household per year and is deposited into the general fund account to be used for operating expenses and legal support as needed. Members who provide an email address will receive the monthly newsletter, minutes of membership meetings and any announcements via email or robo calls. You may choose to have a hardcopy of the newsletter delivered for a fee.

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

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


