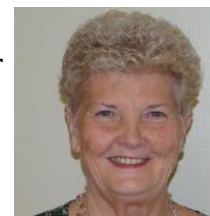
My door is always open to you, our members! I love the people in the park and work hard for all of you.

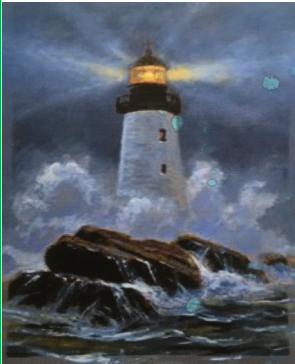

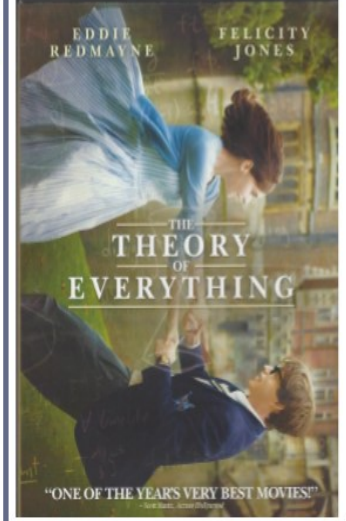

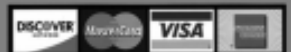
