## From our Social Director—Julie Glenna

Happy Fall. To our US residents returning, drive safe and we look forward to seeing everyone again.

We all have shown great strength and respect for each other during this pandemic. Your diligence in following the guidelines set forth by ELS, as well as the state and national regulations, has kept our community safe. Thank you.

The HOA Board has been constantly working with our resident management team to get activities going again. We have submitted plans to them for several activities and have received approvals to begin several different activities. We will continue to work with them on your behalf.

Our Canadian friends and family are dealing with a border that, as of this time is closed through November. Due to the restrictions currently in place, our annual Thanksgiving Dinner and our Saturday Night Dinner Dances will not take place in the month of November. We will all miss the wonderful dinners and the chance to get together with friends. We wish you all our sincere blessings for a wonderful Thanksgiving holiday.

The good news is that we continue to submit plans to community management and we are happy to say that Monday Night Sandwiches and Ice Cream Socials have been approved and will be moving forward.

Due to the current restrictions, masks will be required and social distancing must be practiced using the table layout done by ELS. The maximum capacity in the clubhouse at one time is 100, this includes attendees and kitchen staff.

## New Procedure for Monday Night Sandwiches:

Our first Monday Night Sandwich night will be on Monday, November 9th. Advance tickets are required and will be sold on Monday, Nov 2nd and Tuesday, Nov 3rd from 10:00 to 12:00 noon.

On November 9 you will come to the clubhouse between 4:30 – 5:30 pm and give your name to the person(s) out front. We will pull your order and process it for you. **Please come gradually throughout the hour as to allow for everyone to move along in a timely fashion.** You can choose to eat in or take out. Maximum capacity in the clubhouse is 100 people at one time. That number will also include those preparing the meal for you. To accommodate more residents we are limiting the number on the teams during that hour to allow as many people in as possible. Once you have finished eating, we ask that you wipe down your table using the anti-bacterial wipes & spray which are placed around the clubhouse. We appreciate your help with this.

We are following the guidelines used in restaurants with all pre-packaged condiments and silverware. Your lemonade and coffee will be given to you from the kitchen window, along with your meal. We were able to keep our same pricing from last year.


To allow others to enjoy their ice cream goodies, please assist us in wiping down your tables with the wipes and spray provided.

## Frequently asked questions:

## Q: How do I let my guests in the gate?

A: You will provide your guest with your 4-digit gate code prior to their arrival. Once your guest is in the visitor lane at the entrance, they will enter your assigned 4-digit gate code in the call box, a call will be sent to the phone number you provided upon moving into the community, once you answer the phone you will have to press (9) from your phone to grant them access into the park.

### Q: I followed the directions and for some reason the gate wouldn't open! What do I do?

A: We understand the gate can be quite confusing sometimes, so here's what you can tell your guest: "The office is open 8:30AM-5PM Monday-Friday just put in the gate code that's listed on the green sign on the call box, identify the resident you are coming to see and they will let you in."

## Q: I don't use my phone often and I never hear it when it does ring... What am I supposed to do?

A: Refer to the answer above.

### Q: Am I allowed to obtain a barcode for a friend or relative?

A: No, barcodes are for resident use only and should not be used by any family members, or friends.

## Q: Where can I purchase a key fob?

A: You can purchase a key fob from the Forest Lake Estates management office for \$25 each, all you need to do is bring the acceptable payment method which is a check or money order made out to Forest Lake Estates and an official document with your address on it.

### Q: How do I obtain a new barcode?

A: You can obtain a bar code from the Forest Lake Estates management office for free, all you need to do is bring your current up to date drivers license, and the valid vehicle registration for the car that needs a new barcode. One of our community representatives will be more than happy to install for you.

The purpose of the Forest Lake Estates Home Owners' Association (FLE HOA) is to ensure our membership and our perspective members are aware of the goals of our Association. We are now conducting our 2021 Membership Campaign.

Our mandate is to:

- Operate an Association encompassing the well-being of the business affairs of the Forest Lake Estates Home Owners' Association.
- Promote FRIENDSHIP and HARMONY between FLE HOA and the Park Owners, ELS .
- Ensure rent increases are REASONABLE AND WORTHY; and,
- Ensure ELS is in compliance with 723 F.S., the Prospectus, and all exhibits thereto.

While it is important to maintain a harmonious relationship between FLE Residents and ELS, it is also important to know that the FLE HOA stands firm on these mandates. All Forest Lake Estates residents have an investment that must be protected. The FLE HOA is the ONLY entity recognized by the State of Florida to represent all of the residents in the Park. The HOA works with ELS to assure that the park is maintained appropriately and to protect the best interests of all residents. All residents are encouraged to join the HOA and support the HOA Board of Directors as they work to support you. From November through MidJanuary, membership sales are held in the clubhouse on Mondays from 10:00AM until 12 Noon. The dues are \$20 per household per year and are deposited into our general fund to be used for operating expenses, activities and legal support. Members who provide an email address will receive the monthly newsletter, minutes of membership meetings and any announcements via email. You may choose to have a hardcopy newsletter delivered to your home November to April. Newsletters are only delivered in the summer to members without email. Board Members are elected each year in January. You must be a paid member to be eligible to run for a seat on the board and to vote in the election.

## ASSOCIATE MEMBERSHIPS are available for Renters only



## **Did You Know**

**Household trash** collection is a free service. During Winter, November 1 thru 1st Monday in May, trash is picked up Monday and Thursday for houses below Ritchie Lane. Above Ritchie (closer to clubhouse) pick up is Tuesday and Friday. Summer hours May 1st to November 1st, collection days are Monday and Thursday for all streets. Trash must be bagged and in covered cans and should be put out by 7:00am. If you set bags out at night, they may be "opened" by critters. All yard clippings need to be bagged or tied, no longer than 4 feet long. All cardboard boxes must be flattened and tied together. TVs and appliances will not be picked up.

**Answer**: Julie, thank you for your question. This issue has been discussed with ELS a number of times. The last time it was discussed was at the August 27th meeting of the HOA Board and ELS. At that meeting, we had photos and suggested that the trimming take place more often and closer to the lake. We were advised that the lawn care vendors are paid to trim to the water's edge. ELS agreed to discuss this with the vendor. If you continue to see issues, we can now only suggest that you complete a Resident Concern form, bring it to the office, make sure to get a signed/dated copy for yourself and the HOA board. Once the concern is registered with the office, we can then follow up when we meet with them.


## ...Some News about Activities and Events

It's time to start planning for our ninth season of Putt-Putt. Due to covid 19 concerns, social distancing will come into play this year and our league format has changed. Hopefully we will have enough interest so that I can carry out the new plan. 20 teams filling out for separate divisions will be scheduled on Mondays 3:00 to 4:10 PM, Wednesdays (two sessions early & late) will be scheduled at 3:00 to 4:10 PM, (early) and 4:20 to 5:50 P.M. (late) and 20 teams will be scheduled on Fridays 3:00 to 4:10 PM. The first scheduled week will be Monday November the 2<sup>nd</sup>, Wednesday the 4<sup>th</sup> (early and late), and Friday November 6<sup>th</sup>. Sundays will be make-up by appointment only. For skins purposes, Sunday will be considered the end of the week. If you are able to play on more than one time slot please let me know, I could use as much flexibility as possible. Tee times will now be scheduled to play head to head competion with another team from the same division. Make-up plans are in place, if you cannot arrive on time you will have the opportunity to play your matches.

Every match will provide for teams to earn points. Scores will be considered Net Score with the same previous year's handicapping system to apply. 

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
