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### From our Social Director—Julie Glenna



#### **Lending for Little Ones**



## Let's Talk About the Rules

We have heard some chatter about rules and lack of enforcement. Most of you received a copy of the rules and regulations as part of a mass mailing, sent to all residents by ELS. New residents are given a copy of the rules at the time of the closing on their home. Rest assured that each month when the board meets with ELS, we bring up rules violations which have been brought to our attention. While it is not our responsibility to enforce the rules, there seems to be some lack of "knowledge" of the rules, so we have decided to do a monthly article highlighting the "General Rules of Conduct for Residents" as outlined in our Welcome Package for new residents. #### **Vehicle Rules**

- 1. Operators of vehicles and golf carts must have a valid driver's license.
- 2. **Speed limit** in the community is **15 MPH**, please obey it. Stop signs are there for a reason, please **STOP**.
- 3. Pedestrians, golf carts and bicycles have the right of way.
- 4. Golf carts and bicycles **MUST** observe all traffic rules. (Speed limit **15MPH** and stop at **STOP** signs).
- 5. Bicycles and golf carts must have front lights and back reflectors if being used after dark.
- 6. **DO NOT** park on sidewalks or lawns at any time.
- 7. Vehicles **MAY NOT** be parked on the street overnight (12:00am—7:00am).
- 8. Campers, motor homes, trailers, boats or delivery vehicles ARE allowed to park in front of the resident's home for a 24 hour period for "loading/unloading" **ONLY**.
- 9. Guests may use the grass areas on Presidential Circle or Paquette Way (no motorhomes, trailers or commercial vehicles allowed).
- 10. Mechanical work on vehicles is **NOT** permitted.

I moved to Bream Circle a little over a year ago because I wanted to live on the water. While I understand that they can't run the lawnmowers close to the water, I don't understand why they mow here two or three times before they come back to weed whack the grass near the water. Sometimes the grass is almost a foot tall and it could be anywhere from a foot to 6 feet from the water. Why not weed whack every time they mow, like they do everywhere else in the park?

**Answer**: The HOA board has been meeting with ELS Park Management over the summer. The HOA board has asked repeatedly about the upkeep of homes and has been told that with all that is going on with COVID, ELS doesn't want to place any additional anxiety on residents. The HOA board does not agree with this approach and we have asked to meet with a regional VP to discuss items we feel need to be addressed. This meeting is scheduled for August 27th and both of these items are on the list of things we want to discuss. We will share any information we receive with you as soon as possible.

### **Pool Rules During Covid**

Below are the rules posted at the pool by front office management. These are the rules in place as of the date this newsletter was prepared. We will keep you abreast of any changes as they occur. Please be respectful of the rules to avoid losing pool privileges for all. Thank you.

- The pool is open to residents only. Visiting family members and friends are not allowed until further notice.
- Those using the pool will be responsible for maintaining social distancing protocol. A limited amount of seating will be provided and spaced according to recommended distancing. Please DO NOT relocate the chairs.
  Congregating within distances of less than six feet may occur between members of the same household only.
- Anyone who is not feeling well and/or displaying any symptoms such as fever, cough or headache is prohibited from using the pool. Please stay home and self quarantine.
- Capacity will be limited for the pool area and spa in order to facilitate social distancing. Signage will be posted in these areas accordingly.
- The pool area will be closed every two hours to allow our maintenance team to clean high touch surfaces and to allow others an opportunity to enter the pool.
- Pool hours of operation will be 9AM—5PM Monday through Saturday.

Debbie says "I am amazed at how enjoyable it is to put feelings, hope, and encouragement on a little thing like a rock and share it with others by hiding them and letting others find them. Something as simple as a little game of hide and seek can bring joy and encouragement to others."

Once the artistry was in play, they needed a way to make people aware of what they were doing. So the Facebook Group "Sister's Rock" was hatched. When and if you find a rock, they only ask that you take a photo of it and post it to the Sister's Rock Group page. You then decide if you want to keep the rock or hide it again for someone else to find. It seems that people have been making rocks to be found by a specific person based on that person's likes. I have seen rocks painted with ocean scenes, flowers, Mickey & Minnie, Inspirational Sayings, dots, designs and more .
