~ 2023 FOREST LAKE ESTATES ELECTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS \sim

There are 4 positions open on the Board of Directors. There are 7 candidates; Garry Chickery, Wendy Coache, Patricia (Pat) Fletcher, Arthur (Art) Hayden, Virginia (Ginny) Preble, Ed Stokes and William (Bill) Wiseman, running for the 4 open positions.

You are voting to fill the open seats on the Board of Directors. After the votes are counted, the candidates receiving the top three vote counts will fill the 3 three-year positions and the candidate with the 4th highest vote count will fill a two-year position.

The election will be held on January 11, 2023, in the stage side of the clubhouse. To make sure everyone who wants to vote has an opportunity to vote, there will be a morning session from 10am - 1pm and afternoon/evening session from 4pm - 6pm. **The clubhouse will be closed to all activities for that entire day.**

Absentee ballots are available. If you wish to vote by absentee ballot, please contact Nancy Matthews to obtain a ballot and absentee voting instructions. Absentee ballots must be completed as outlined in the instructions and must be received prior to January 10, 2022.

Results of the election will be announced at the HOA General Meeting on Thursday, January 12, 2023. Once the new board members have been announced, the new Board of Directors will then meet to elect the officers of the board.

Meet the Candidates

Garry Chickery - I have been serving on the board since 2020. I am an Air Force veteran of 24 years, after which I worked in the family office furniture business. We moved to Forest Lake Estates in 2017. I was appointed to the FLE HOA Board in 2020 and was then elected in 2021. After the election, I was nominated and accepted the position of membership/directory director. During my tenure on the board I have been working very hard to streamline the membership process and save this HOA some money on printing, etc. In



addition, I have also been a team player, stepping up to sell tickets, work in the kitchen and volunteer for other various functions. During a summer meeting with ELS, by asking a simple question, the ball got rolling to get an upgrade to our outdated bingo system. If you choose to reelect me, I will continue to work very hard for the community.

Wendy Coache - I am the current secretary of the FLE HOA. I am a snowbird and have been at FLE since December 2011. I have served on the board in the position of Secretary since January of 2017 and have been editor of the newsletter since February of 2020. The by-laws for this association clearly state that no member of the Board of Directors may serve more than three (3) consecutive terms on the Board. That said, should you reelect me, I will spend my



final term assisting with the transition of the job of secretary to someone new. Thank you.

Pat Fletcher - I came to FLE in June of 2022 . I was a teacher for 31 years in the area of Secondary Language Arts. I also worked for the City of Trinidad, CO. in the capacity of police of

ficer for 23 years. I have one son, Brian, who is married and living in Denver.

My civic commitments are; Council person on the City of Trinidad CO city council, President of the Carnegie Library Board of Directors as well as the Trinidad Area Arts Council, Noah's Ark Animal Welfare Association, and Trinidad Children's Museum, Chairman on the Trinidad Arts and Culture Advisory Board as well as the Creative District Board of Directors, and the Trinidad Parks and Rec

DECEMBER 3, 2022 CHRISTMAS CRAFT SHOW REPORT

THANK YOU to the over 30 some volunteers who helped make our December 3rd annual craft fair a HUGE success. Without all of their help this could not be accomplished. The clubhouse was closed to activities at 3:00 on Friday and a crew came in and tore down the round tables and chairs and set up the long tables for the vendors to display their wares on. Most of the vendors came in Friday evening from 6:00 til 9:00 and got set up and organized for Saturday morning. On Saturday at 1:00 a crew came in to tear down the long tables, a lady to run the sweeper, several removed the trash and then the round tables were reset, restoring the clubhouse to its normal layout. We had someone at the front gate on Friday evening to let the vendors in and 2 people in the clubhouse to help the vendor's locate their space and bring in their merchandise. On Saturday there were 5 parking lot attendants in golf carts to show people where to park and to shuttle them back and forth to the clubhouse. There were 2 drivers to pick up donuts, a floor monitor to relieve vendors when they needed a break and a couple who played Christmas carols, creating a festive atmosphere for shoppers. In addition, we had a kitchen crew of 6, plus a cashier, raising \$562 for the HOA. They served donuts and coffee in the morning to our vendors, volunteers and shoppers. They also served a delicious luncheon of sandwiches and home made soups.

A big thank you also goes to all of our residents who came up and bought the wonderful gifts and decorations for the season, as well as other useful items for their homes. Those of you who didn't make it, missed a really nice display. We had a total of 79 crafters (12 who were new to our show) set up in 55 spaces this year, so we had a large variety of merchandise to choose from. Our resident bake sale was back again this year, set up on 5 tables in the screen room, making it easier to shop and see everything. Six volunteers manned the bake sale which raised \$860.50 for the Thomas Promise Foundation. The \$500 profit made from the show was donated to the local Zephyrhills Pregnancy Center.

The date for next year's show is December 2, 2023. We need a new Chairperson or perhaps Co-Chairs to head this up. I have written up all the information and dates to co-ordinate the project and will be happy to consult, but will not be able to lead the project next year.

PLAY ORGANIZATION WEDNESDAY PLAY STARTS @ 3:30 PM - 4:15 PM NEW: NO STARTS AFTER 4:15 PM

- Putt-Putt is each Wednesday; each person must pay \$1 toward skins when they check in at the scorer table.
- Players will be given scorecards and assigned their opponents. Play new opponents each week.
- After playing 18 holes, the foursome will turn in scorecard at the scorer table, w/gross & net scores.
- Each team should double check score on the scorecard before turning it in.
- NEW: If there is a weather-related cancellation, play is cancelled for that week. No rain dates.
 ---For that reason, pre-plays recorded for that week will not count, and not count towards the three MAX limit.
- Makeups & pre-plays are only as follows: TUESDAY 10:00 11:00 A.M. or THURSDAY 3:00 4:00 P.M.
- NEW: Makeups & pre-plays are limited to three MAXIMUM (total) per team for the entire season.
- NEW: After three (3) makeups & pre-plays, zeroes will be recorded for any future league nights missed.
- Makeups must be completed to participate in the weekly Skins, Low Gross/Low Net competitions.

PLAY PROCEDURES

- On ODD numbered weeks, the designated player #1 will putt all ODD holes first.
- On EVEN numbered weeks, the designated player #2 will putt all ODD holes first.
- Replay the hole if a player plays out of turn, and it is recognized before group leaves the hole.
- . If more than two holes are played out of turn, the entire match must be replayed.

BASIC RULES OF PLAY

- NEW: Tee area for each hole is located behind the first set of bricks, not inside the bricks.
- Maximum number of strokes to be scored per hole is 6. Max number of strokes posted per team, per round is 54.
- If the ball is within the course, and rests near a sidewalk, rock, brick, or item on the course which hinders your backswing, you may place the ball six inches from the obstacle without penalty. You may not place the ball any closer to the hole. As a guideline, six inches (6") is about the length of any US paper currency.
- If a putt is hit off the course, it is a <u>one stroke penalty</u>. To proceed; place the ball where it left the course, but no closer to the hole. Your partner hits the next shot.
- If a putt is hit into and then comes to rest within the white stones (Holes #2, #11, & #13), return the ball to the tee.
 It is a <u>one stroke penalty</u>. Your partner hits the next shot (3rd shot) from the tee area (behind the first set of bricks.)
- Ball stuck under the bridge on hole #14; pick up and place the ball on the designated "X". No stroke penalty.
- 7. NEW: Accidental tapping of the ball on the course counts as one stroke. Next player hits from that ball position.
- SKINS: No more carryover Skins week-to-week. All holes with multiple teams who have canceled each other out are now placed in a drawing, except Hole #8. The winning hole participants will equally split the week's Skins' pot.

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
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
