



Notes from FLEHOA Recycling Committee

Recycling in our park is important and we are improving. Here is what is available in the Park:

Newspapers and Cardboard: - Bins are located inside the white fenced structure just down from the street from the mail boxes. There are two bins – if the first is full, use the second door to get to the other bins. **PLEASE**, no plastic bags....remove the papers from bags. Plastic bags cause damage to the sorting machines. Cardboard must be cut or folded to flat pieces; **absolutely** no Styrofoam, foam peanuts, air pillows, or any other packing material.

Aluminum Cans for Kids. "Cans for Kids" wagons are located at the Natale home at 6450 Presidential (right across the street from the big pool and at Len Hitchcock's home at 5702 Viau Way. There are also collection cans at the clubhouse. PLEASE: only clean aluminum cans (soda and beer) no cat food or other food cans. Keep the tabs intact, they add to the weight and money collected. The Cans for Kids program money goes directly to the Family Ministries (Children's Home) in Seffner, FL. This is such a worth-while program, your support of it is appreciated.

PLASTIC BAGS: Walmart and Publix and other stores have bins to receive plastic bags. Also the Thrift Shops in the area appreciate them for packing things that they sell.

GLASS, PLASTIC, AND METAL CANS – there is currently nothing in the park yet, but the committee is working on it. YOU can take an unsorted bag to the East Pasco Transfer Station = 9626 Handcart Road, Dade City, FL 33525. Phone (352) 521-0500. Hours – Monday – Saturday 7:00 am – 5:00 pm. Other items accepted are furniture, appliances, TV's (some items have a cost to drop off). Handcart road is located off Eiland Blvd (CR 54) on the way to Home Depot. You can also contact the Morales trash pick up service in the park to take away larger items (for a fee).

VERY IMPORTANT – the newspaper/cardboard bins are ONLY for paper and cardboard. The kitchen dumpsters are ONLY for kitchen use. Absolutely no private dumping should go in either.
