Newsletter Circulation Update

At the December General Membership Meeting, we voted on the distribution of the printed newsletter. The reason for the vote was to save printing expenses while trying to recoup some of our legal fees from the negotiations over the prospectus changes. If you attended the meeting, you are aware that we shared the cost of printing the newsletter and compared that to the cost of posting the newsletter to our website. The website provides you with a newsletter in full color, as opposed to a black and white printed copy.

The result of the vote was to change the process and charge a fee for a printed copy of the newsletter. Beginning with the February edition of the FLE HOA Happenings, if you wish to receive a printed copy, the cost will be \$10 for 6 months (November through April) of the newsletter. This fee is due by the January General Membership Meeting. If you are interested in receiving a printed copy, you can drop off your \$10 to Garry Chickery at 6202 Forest Lake Drive. Garry may also be contacted at 813-715-2900.

The newsletter team has also decided to go back to a "NewsBrief" during the months of May through October. Calendars will still be prepared and are available to anyone on the website. For those full time residents with no internet access and no email, you will receive a printed version of the "Newsbrief" at no charge. Details on that will follow.

We have also become aware that we are in violation of Florida Statute 723 as it pertains to our Associate Members. The law specifically states 723.075 (1) **The association may not have a member or shareholder who is not a bona fide owner of a mobile home located in the park.** We believe we have worked out a solution so that "renters, formerly known as Associate Members" will get information they are entitled to by paying the \$10 for the 6 months of printed newsletters. Full time renters will be entitled to printed copies of the summer Newsbrief. If you are a renter who has already paid your 2022 fee, please contact either Janice Collins or Garry Chickery for more information on the process going forward.

I now work part time in Lakeland for a Limousine company.


I'm running for this position because I believe I have some good ideas and I do care about everybody in this park. I would like the opportunity to represent everybody in this park.



<u>Play Organization</u> <u>MUST PLAY ON WEDNESDAY TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR SKINS.</u>

- Putt- putt is each Wednesday; each person must pay \$1 toward skins when they check in at the scorer table.
- Players will be given scorecards and assigned their opponents. Play new opponents each week.
- After playing 18 holes, the foursome will turn in scorecard at the scorer table.
- Each team should double check score on the scorecard.
- If there is a weather-related cancellation, the following week two rounds will be played.
- Makeups are only as follows: TUESDAY 10:00 11:00 AM or THURSDAY 3:00 4:00 PM.

Play Procedures

- On ODD numbered weeks, the designated female player will putt all ODD holes first.
- On EVEN numbered weeks, the designated male player will putt all ODD holes first.
- Replay the hole if a player plays out of turn, and it is recognized before group leaves the hole.
- If more than two holes are played out of turn, the match must be replayed.

Basic Rules of Play

- Maximum number of strokes to be scored is 6; maximum number a team can post per round is 54.
- If the ball rests near sidewalk, rock, brick or item on the course, place the ball six inches from the obstacle. This is about the length of any US paper currency.
- If a putt is hit off the course, take a one stroke penalty then place the ball where it was hit out of bounds, but not closer to the hole or line of flight.
- Ball hit into the white stones (#2, #11, & #13), place back on the tee, add penalty stroke, & partner hits 3rd shot.
- Ball stuck under the bridge on hole #14, pick up and place on the side of the bridge toward hole on the X.

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


