

A thank-you is very easy to give to any of our volunteers and much appreciated to hear.

Since our meeting we have met with ELS management to follow-up on some concerns we brought to their attention. Here are the updates: Linda Tolantino, manager from Crystal Lakes is filling in until Peggy Cortes returns from maternity leave, probably the end of April. Noel has been hired and is replacing Linda. A new front desk person has been hired but has not yet started as of this writing. Sydney Morris, Regional Manager will be more visible, and present should we need assistance. The fence around the new 27acre project on Gateway Drive is going up and our new walk-in freezer/cooler should begin the end of April. Beginning April 1st, if you have a remote (clicker) for the front gate, it will no longer work. Some residents are using the remote to try and open the exit gate. When they do that, it opens the entry gate instead and the entry gate will not close until a car passes through that gate. That is why the entry gate is sometimes standing open.

I understand the frustration that we all are feeling with the changes made due to the Coronavirus. We are sorry that our northern friends and "family" have left to return home and wish everyone safe travels and good health. We look forward to your return in the fall. 




