~ 2023 FOREST LAKE ESTATES ELECTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS ~

Our 2023 election will be held to elect four members to the Board of Directors.

To run for a position on the Board of Directors, you must be an HOA member in good standing, with your 2023 dues paid in full. Candidates should be prepared to give a maximum two-minute presentation to introduce themselves to the membership. This information will be presented to the membership at the December 8, 2022 General Membership Meeting.

The General Membership elects the board members and the board members then meet to elect the officers. For full information on the election process, please see the article on page 4.

Volunteers will be needed to assist on election day (Wednesday, January 11, 2023). These volunteers will check in voters, supply ballots to voters and count the resulting votes. If you have any interest in either running for a position on the board or assisting on the election committee, please contact Nancy Matthews, Election Chairperson.

Voting and Casting Your Ballot

The stage side of the clubhouse will be closed off on the day of the election and no one will be allowed in except poll workers and voters. Hours will be 10:00am - 1:00pm and then from 4:00pm - 6:00pm to allow everyone the opportunity to vote. Doors will be closed from 1:00pm - 4:00pm, no one will be allowed in the clubhouse during that time.

You must be a current member of the HOA in order to cast a ballot. You will first go to the check in desk to sign in. You will then be issued a ballot, a small ballot envelope and a legal sized envelope. These items cannot be removed from the voting area. You will proceed to a table where you will mark your ballot with your selections. There cannot be any writing or markings on the ballot except the "X" beside the person(s) you want to vote for. You will then place the completed ballot in the small ballot envelope, seal the envelope. The outside of that envelope must be blank. Then place that sealed ballot envelope inside the legal sized envelope, seal the envelope and mark the outside of the legal sized envelope with your signature and lot number and seal that envelope. Your ballot is now sealed inside of two envelopes. The name on the outside envelope identifies the ballot as a legitimate ballot. Proceed to the ballot box, where a poll worker will verify your name and check you off as having cast a ballot. You will then place your ballot in the ballot box.

Absentee Ballots

If you know you will not be present for voting at the election, as soon as the ballot is prepared (usually the day after the December HOA meeting), you may contact Nancy Matthews to request a ballot. A ballot can be sent to you via email, but you must follow the process outlined above and mail the ballot to the chairperson. The ballot must be received prior to the day of the election to be included in the vote count.

Counting the Ballots

There are twelve people who assist with the compiling of the votes. The ballot box is opened and the envelopes are sorted into bundles of 25. A line of six people is seated on either side of a table and the process of counting the ballots begins. The first person slits open the envelope of the first bundle. The envelope is then placed face down and handed to the second person, who then opens the envelope, removes the sealed ballot envelope and passes just the sealed ballot envelope to the third person. The third person slits open the ballot envelope and passes the envelope to the fourth person. The fourth person removes the ballot from the envelope and passes only the ballot to the fifth person. The fifth person unfolds the ballot and places it face down on the table. The sixth person bundles just the ballots in bundles of 25. At that point, all envelopes and the ballots from each bundle are numbered and set aside. Once all envelopes have been opened, the counting begins. Each bundle of 25 ballots will be counted and tallied on tally sheets by two different sets of three tally workers. The tally sheets are given the same number as the bundle. The tally sheet totals must agree horizontally and vertically by both sets of tally workers. If the numbers don't agree, the election chairperson will review to locate the error. This does not happen often. The chairperson locates the problem and the tally counters make the final corrections to the sheets.

FLE QUILTERS GROUP

The FLE Quilters Group meets every Wednesday at the Clubhouse from 11:00 a.m. until 3:00 p.m. We have approximately 22 members in our group. Our members work on their own projects and we may do a group project for anyone who wants to participate. No quilting experience is necessary. You should have a basic knowledge of operating a sewing machine and some piecing/sewing experience is helpful. You must have your own sewing machine. We welcome all quilters and sewers.

During the 2021/2022 “quilt year”, we made two small group projects: an applique Christmas tree and a pieced Valentine’s Day heart. Andy Martlock organized and provided instruction for the applique Christmas tree. Andy also did a hands-on demonstration for cleaning and maintaining our sewing machines. Thanks to Andy from all of us.

On March 2 the group resumed our yearly pillowcase sew day for the Tampa Bay Chapter of Ryan’s Case for Smiles. This is an organization that provides pillowcases for hospitalized children. It was founded in 2007 and has 120 chapters worldwide. The Tampa Bay Chapter is the second largest chapter in the U.S. and provides 1,200 pillowcases a month to nine area hospitals. This year our group of 14 sewers and 7 helpers (who pinned, folded, stacked, turned and ran!) made 300 pillowcases in four hours. This was a huge effort. We thank everyone who participated in this sew day.

In April, the Quilted Twins Quilt Shop in Dade City, began a charity quilt drive for Ukraine refugees. Many of our members had either left FLE or were in the process of packing to leave. But, there were still a few members who were able to contribute to this effort. A huge shout out to Lora Blake, Ruth Ann McKean, Doreen MacMahon, Carrol Norquay, Carol Stamper, and Pat Zimmerman who made and donated 20 quilts and 24 pillowcases. Our Activities Director, Steve Bushey, was a volunteer at Quilted Twins helping prepare all the boxes on pallets and loading them into a moving truck for transport to Poland. The Quilted Twins raised approximately \$100,000 and more than 4,000 quilts were shipped in 79 boxes. All of those quilts have been delivered to Poland for distribution to residents of Ukraine.

Recycling News

Recycling has become a popular and environmentally supportive activity for the residents of Forest Lake Estates. All items are recycled and it keeps quite a lot out the garbage collection.

PAPER & CARDBOARD:

Every Saturday from 10 am to 12 noon. It is helpful if you cut large boxes down for ease in handling by the volunteers. No cardboard that has had food in it (ex. pizza boxes) is not accepted. No Styrofoam please.

PLASTIC & METAL CANS:

Collection is scheduled for every 3 weeks on Saturday in conjunction with Paper and Cardboard collection. Watch calendar and Sunday Announcements for dates.

A few tips to help the plastic and tin can program be even more successful. All containers must be clean, this means washing the metal cans and rinsing out laundry detergent containers and bleach bottles so any product left in the container does not leak out during transport and damage a volunteer’s truck bed. We have also determined that if you crush your water bottles that it makes the load less bulky to transport. Finally, please remove the caps and throw them away. NO GLASS ACCEPTED.

CANS FOR KIDS:

Aluminum cans (soda and beer) are collected in the wagon at 6450 Presidential Circle, and in the clubhouse in special mark “recycle cans” and on the patio outside the pool. Cans must be empty and clean. The received from this project goes to a “Children’s home” to support their activities. Cans may be crushed.

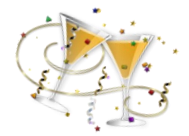

PLAY ORGANIZATION WEDNESDAY PLAY STARTS @ 3:30 PM – 4:15 PM **NEW: NO STARTS AFTER 4:15 PM**

- Putt-Putt is each Wednesday; each person must pay \$1 toward skins when they check in at the scorer table.
- Players will be given scorecards and assigned their opponents. Play new opponents each week.
- After playing 18 holes, the foursome will turn in scorecard at the scorer table, w/gross & net scores.
- Each team should double check score on the scorecard before turning it in.
- **NEW:** If there is a weather-related cancellation, play is cancelled for that week. **No rain dates.**
---For that reason, pre-plays recorded for that week will not count, and not count towards the three MAX limit.
- **Makeups & pre-plays are only as follows: TUESDAY 10:00 – 11:00 A.M. or THURSDAY 3:00 – 4:00 P.M.**
- **NEW:** Makeups & pre-plays are limited to three **MAXIMUM (total)** per team for the entire season.
- **NEW:** After three (3) makeups & pre-plays, zeroes will be recorded for any future league nights missed.

PLAY PROCEDURES

- On **ODD** numbered weeks, the designated player **#1** will putt all ODD holes first.
- On **EVEN** numbered weeks, the designated player **#2** will putt all ODD holes first.
- Replay the hole if a player plays out of turn, and it is recognized before group leaves the hole.
- If more than **two** holes are played out of turn, the entire match must be replayed.

BASIC RULES OF PLAY

1. **NEW:** Tee area for each hole is located behind the first set of bricks, not inside the bricks.
2. Maximum number of strokes to be scored per hole is **6**. Max number of strokes posted per team, per round is **54**.
3. If the ball is within the course, and rests **near** a sidewalk, rock, brick, or item on the course which hinders your backswing, you may place the ball six inches from the obstacle without penalty. You may not place the ball any closer to the hole. As a guideline, six inches (6") is about the length of any US paper currency.
4. If a putt is hit off the course, it is a one stroke penalty. To proceed; place the ball where it left the course, but no closer to the hole. Your partner hits the next shot.
5. If a putt is hit into and then comes to rest within the white stones (Holes #2, #11, & #13), return the ball to the tee. It is a one stroke penalty. Your partner hits the next shot (3rd shot) from the tee area (*behind the first set of bricks.*)
6. Ball stuck under the bridge on hole #14; pick up and place the ball on the designated "X". *No stroke penalty.*
7. **NEW:** Accidental tapping of the ball on the course counts as one stroke. Next player hits from that ball position.
