A Few Items from the Board of Directors

As Carolyn stated, ELS had asked for wish list ideas for the 2022 Capital Expenditure Projects. Below is the memo that was submitted to ELS.

Resident Wish List of Cap Ex Projects

- 1. Have a retaining wall and public walkway built around the lake. It would be a completely new amenity and we believe it would be used by residents.
- 2. Build an outside covered pavilion in the grass area between the clubhouse and the first house on Spring Lake. It would also be a new amenity and we believe it would be used frequently for outside activities.
- 3. Misting fans for the outside patio. When it is hot, it is hard to hold activities here and misting fans could be used to help cool the area.
- 4. A projector and oversized screen that could be used outdoors to host events such as movie nights, sporting event nights (think Super Bowl, World Series, Daytona 500, Kentucky Derby, just to name a few).
- 5. Bocce Ball court in the grass area near the horseshoe pits.
- 6. Park wide Wi-Fi. The resident who submitted this one said the RV park has it, this would keep us in line with them.
- 7. Sidewalk sweeper/scrubber
- 8. Street sweeper
- 9. Upgrade to the Bingo system (current equipment is outdated)
- 10. Add a second entrance/exit gate
- 11. Better trash receptacles and disposal process at the dog park

Items that were submitted that we believe are either near completion or part of future development

- Small Variety Store
- Handicap lift for the Pool

Items we think fall under routine maintenance

- Board in Tennis Courts for practicing or playing handball (There was a board there. When the new fencing was installed it was never replaced.)
- Upgrade to the front gate system to make it easier to gain entry to the community
- Shuffleboard court resurfacing

Items the HOA would like to look into if allowed

- Digital Information Board for announcements

Finally, and take this for what it is worth

We had one resident, who loudly declared to be speaking on behalf of the majority, although we disagree, who wished for the termination of the current management staff. The individual stated in his request that he knew his request would not be submitted because no one on the HOA board had the courage (that is our word, cleaned up from the actual request) to submit it. We will share his written request with you and answer any questions about these requests at next week's joint meeting.

Resident Concern Forms

All complaints to Community Management must be made in writing, signed and dated, and must be submitted to the Community office. Although we know the process can be cumbersome, it would benefit all of us, if, when you have a concern, you complete the Resident Concern Form, bring the completed form to the office, have them sign and date the form (this acknowledges receipt of the form) and ask for a copy. If you would also provide any member of the HOA Board with a copy, we will then have a record and paper trail which we can use to follow up. We cannot stress this enough. The paper trail is important when there is no response to a written concern.



2021 FLE HOA MEMBERSHIP CAMPAIGN

The purpose of the Forest Lake Estates Home Owners' Association (FLE HOA) is to ensure our membership and our perspective members are aware of the goals of our Association. We are now conducting our 2021 Membership Campaign.

Our mandate is to:

- Operate an Association encompassing the well-being of the business affairs of the Forest Lake Estates Home Owners' Association.
- Promote FRIENDSHIP and HARMONY between FLE HOA and the Park Owners, ELS.
- Ensure rent increases are REASONABLE AND WORTHY; and,
- Ensure ELS is in compliance with 723 F.S., the Prospectus, and all exhibits thereto.

While it is important to maintain a harmonious relationship between FLE Residents and ELS, it is also important to know that the FLE HOA stands firm on these mandates. All Forest Lake Estates residents have an investment that must be protected. The FLE HOA is the ONLY entity recognized by the State of Florida to represent all of the residents in the Park. The HOA works with ELS to assure that the park is maintained appropriately and to protect the best interests of all residents. All residents are encouraged to join the HOA and support the HOA Board of Directors as they work to support you. From November through MidJanuary, membership sales are held in the clubhouse on Mondays from 10:00AM until 12 Noon. The dues are \$20 per household per year and are deposited into our general fund to be used for operating expenses, activities and legal support. Members who provide an email address will receive the monthly newsletter, minutes of membership meetings and any announcements via email. You may choose to have a hardcopy newsletter delivered to your home November to April. Newsletters are only delivered in the summer to members without email. Board Members are elected each year in January. You must be a paid member to be eligible to run for a seat on the board and to vote in the election.

ASSOCIATE MEMBERSHIPS are available for Renters only

Associate Members will have all the benefits of Members but cannot run for election or vote. The fee is \$15.00 per household. Please contact Janice Collins for the application. (813-788-5678). The Associate Member Form is different from the HOA Membership Form.
