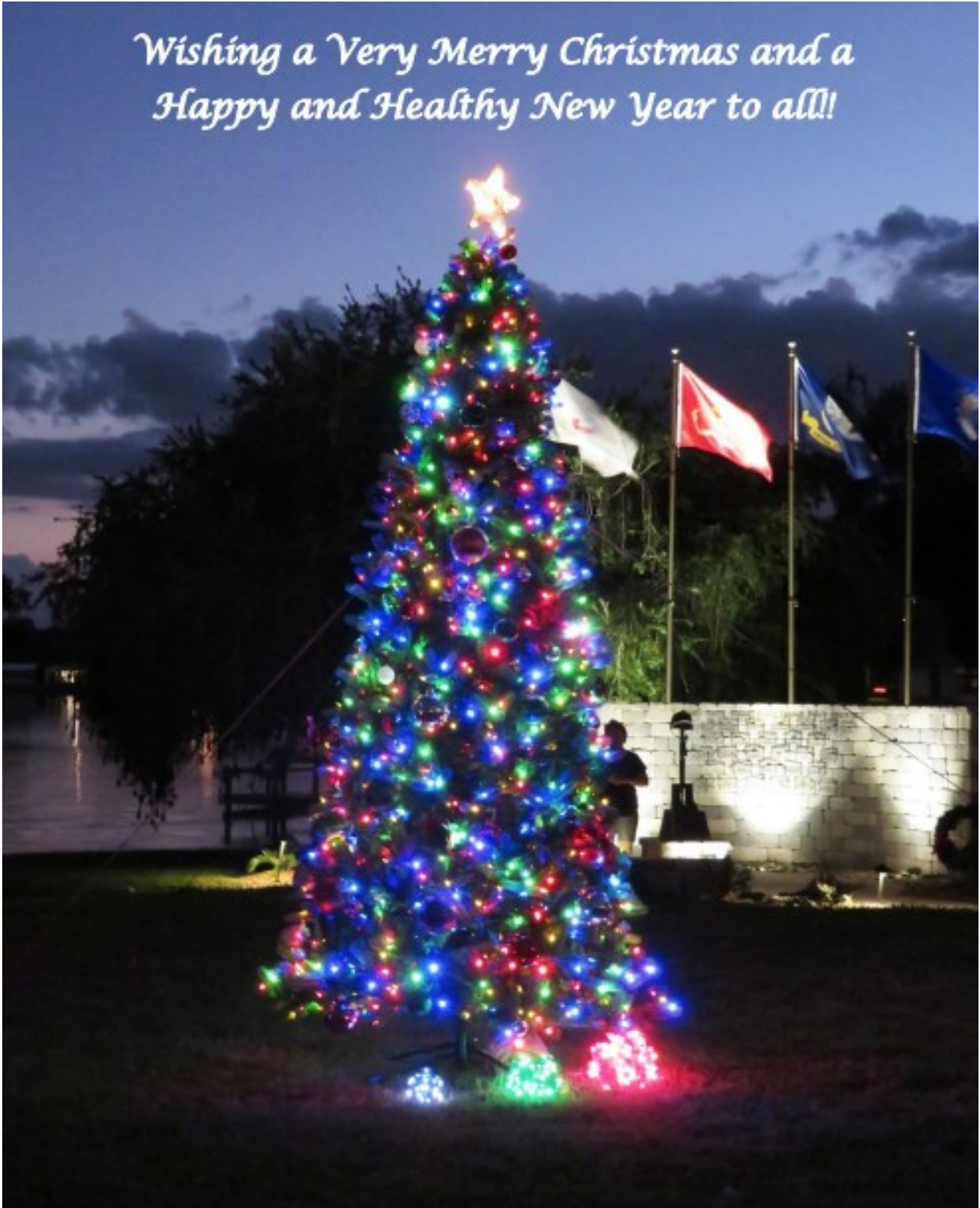

In 1986, Mrs. Dolly Craig, the surviving mother-in-law of Daniel Gleason, a Philadelphia, PA officer killed in the line of duty in 1986, sent her Christmas message to the Concerns of Police Survivors national office. Her daughter Pam, Dan's widow, had been killed in a car accident that August. Dolly wrote "This holiday I am putting two blue lights in my living room window. One is for Dan and the other is for Pam." Dolly Craig is now deceased, but her idea of Project Blue Light burns bright in the hearts of this great country. Project Blue Light has been adopted and is promoted by many police organizations.

We encourage all family and friends of Law Enforcement Officers, as well as Law Enforcement Agencies, to decorate with Blue Lights for the coming Holiday Season. By placing one Blue Light in a window in your home, you will be helping honor those officers killed in the line of duty and support those who continue to patrol our streets and protect our neighborhoods. Blue is symbolic of Peace. Displaying your Blue Lights will show your support for our peacemakers and your hope for a Holiday Season and New Year filled with Peace.

PLAY ORGANIZATION **WEDNESDAY PLAY STARTS @ 3:30 PM – 4:00 PM NO STARTS AFTER 4:00 PM**

- Putt-Putt is each Wednesday; each person must pay \$1 toward skins when they check in at the scorer table. Teams will be given scorecards and assigned their opponents. HCP's are established after two weeks of recorded play.
- After playing 18 holes, teams will submit their scorecard at the scorer table, with legible gross scores per hole.
- Always double check the scorecard as missing or illegible hole scores will then be recorded as a 6.
- If there is a weather-related cancellation, play is cancelled for that week. **No rain dates.**
---For that reason, pre-plays recorded for that week will not count, and not count towards the three MAX limit.

Makeups & pre-plays are only as follows: TUESDAY 10:00 – 11:00 A.M. or THURSDAY 3:00 – 4:00 P.M.

- Makeups & pre-plays are limited to three MAXIMUM (total) per team for the entire season.
- After three (3) makeups & pre-plays, *team average plus 20 points* will be recorded for any future league nights missed. Teams with more than three absences will not be eligible for the season ending Putt Putt Invitational.
- **Weekly Skins/Low Gross/Net competitions: Team makeups must be completed in order to participate each week.**
- **NEW:** We *will* have carryover SKINS this year from week to week.

PLAY PROCEDURES

- On **ODD** numbered weeks, the designated player **#1** will putt all ODD holes first.
- On **EVEN** numbered weeks, the designated player **#2** will putt all ODD holes first.
- Replay the hole if a player plays out of turn, and it is recognized before group leaves the hole.
- If more than **two** holes are played out of turn, the entire match must be replayed.

BASIC RULES OF PLAY

1. Tee area for each hole is located **behind** the first set of bricks, not inside the bricks.
2. Maximum number of strokes to be scored per hole is 6. Max number of strokes posted per team, per round is 54.
3. If the ball is within the course, and rests **near** a sidewalk, rock, brick, or item on the course which hinders your backswing, you may place the ball six inches from the obstacle **without penalty**. You may not place the ball any closer to the hole. As a guideline, six inches (6") is about the length of any US paper currency.
4. If a putt is hit off the course, it is a **one stroke penalty**. To proceed; place the ball where it left the course, but no closer to the hole. Your partner hits the next shot, which for scoring now counts as Shot #3.
5. If a putt is hit into and then comes to rest within the white stones (Holes #2, #11, & #13), return the ball to the tee. It is a **one stroke penalty**. Your partner hits the next shot (3rd shot) from the tee area (**behind the first set of bricks.**)
6. Ball stuck under the bridge on hole #14; pick up and place the ball on the designated "X". **No stroke penalty**.
7. Accidental tapping of the ball on the course counts as one stroke. Next player hits from that ball position.
